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'Go paperless for your water bill'

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PENGURUSAN Air Selangor Sdn Bhd (Air Selangor) is urging account holders to switch from paper bills to e-billing as it is fast, easy and environmentally friendly.

With e-billing, account holders will be able to pay their water bills whenever and wherever online.

Air Selangor aims to see at least a 25% increase in the number of registered e-billing users.

Currently, there are 2.4 million account holders under Air Selangor.

At a campaign held at SACC Mall in Shah Alam to increase awareness on the convenience of e-billing service, Air Selangor chief executive officer Suhaimi Kamaralzaman said e-billing was not only convenient for users but also good for the environment.

"Our e-billing service started

in January last year.

"We now have 400,000 e-billing users and we are hoping to get 200,000 more to achieve a total of 600,000 customers by the first quarter of next year," he added.

"Apart from that, those who are eligible for Skim Air Darul Ehsan should register before Dec 31 this year.

"If your household income is below RM4,000, you can register to enjoy the free water scheme starting March 1, 2020."

He also said Air Selangor was planning to use a more advanced smart meter and a pilot trial would be carried out early next year with 8,000 users in Sepang.

"With our narrowband-Internet of things technology, we are allowing innovation and new technologies to handle bills.

"We are starting with Sepang because it is working towards becoming a smart city," he added.
