Drop in flood victims in Kelantan and Johor, more evacuated in Sabah

JOHOR BARU: Segamat remains the only district in Johor to be affected by floods.

As of noon yesterday, 436 people from 101 families were still housed at nine temporary relief centres.

Flood victims in Segamat involved residents from Jalan Kolan Air, Kampung Batu Badak, Pogoh, Kampung Spang Loi, Kampung Tandong, Kuala Paya, Kampung Sanglang, Kampung Kuing Parah and Kampung Bukit Tunggul, state Local Government, Urban Well-being and Environment Committee chairman Tan Chen Choon said.

The monitoring for floods would continue in all districts by all relevant agencies, he said.

As for the flood situation in Kelantan, the number of victims fell to 1,243 people from 459 families compared to 1,322 victims from 490 families on Saturday night.

The Welfare Department's Information application showed 1,093 victims from 422 families were still housed at five temporary relief centres in Pasir Mas.

In Jeli, 150 victims from 37 families were seeking shelter at relief centres.

Meanwhile, the *ebayji.kelantan.gov.my* website showed that Sungai Golok in Rantau Panjang, Pasir Mas, had exceeded the danger level at 9.72m (the danger level is at 9m). However, all major rivers in the

state are at normal level.

Kelantan police confirmed that five victims have died during the first and second waves of flood in the state so far.

In Sabah, 450 people from 160 families from several villages in Beaufort and Membakut were still housed at Dewan Selagon, Beaufort as at 8am yesterday.

The relief centre was opened at 6.15pm on Thursday after more than 10 villages in Beaufort and 20 villages in Membakut were still inundated due to continuous heavy rain.

Several roads linking the villages were also impassable to traffic. — Berrama
