# Taman Negara to raise entrance fees from January

THE entrance fee to Taman Negara will be revised next year since its opening 70 years ago, reported *Harian Metro*.

From the current RM1 per person, beginning Jan 1, 2020, visitors aged 13 to 60 will have to pay RM30 per entry while those 61 and above will pay RM15.

As for children aged 12 and below, they will be charged RM10.

Pahang Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Wan Rosdy Wan Ismail said the revision was part of the state's initiatives to improve efficiency and reduce revenue leakage.

He said the revision was also in line with the state's vision to become an independent state.
